OCCIDENTAL LIBRARY

SPOTLIGHT ON: OCCIDENTAL LIBRARY

The Occidental Library is tiny but mighty. It serves a very appreciative community of avid readers.

The library has been in the community since at least the 1960s and has been located in its present storefront since the 1970s. Major changes have occurred during those years. Until 2015, the library was only one 18 X 18 foot room. When a space opened up next door we expanded to almost twice a big. This created room for a children's area, two easy chairs, public access computers and a very popular River Friends sale bookcart. We also now have a workspace table and two more chairs.

Melanie McCallum is the branch manager for all three libraries under her—Forestville, Occidental and Guerneville (known as "FOG"). All three are supported by the River Friends of the Library.

Just a couple of ways the Friends have helped Occidental have been by providing shelving for their teen books and extra lighting over the children's area.

The Occidental Library serves a wide geographic area, being the westernmost library facility in the Sonoma County Library system.

It is highly valued and appreciated by its patrons, who can request books from anywhere and use the many services provided in-house.

Occidental Library cannot offer the vast array of services and programs that the "big" libraries have, but it is second to none in its importance to the community it serves.

The library is located at 73 Main Street around the corner from Howards Station Café. The hours are Mon. 10-2, Tue. 1-5, Wed. 10-2, Thu. 1-5, Fri. 10-2, and Sat. 10-2. It is staffed by one Senior Library Associate. Nancy has worked at Occidental for many years and her patrons enjoy her friendly service. Stop in sometime and say hi!

SPRING 2023 BOOK AND BAKE SALE REPORT

We had wonderful weather and a great turnout for our weekend book and bake sale. We made over \$1,500.00 through the sale of books, baked goods and donations.

25 River Friends volunteers put in over 210 hours helping with the book sale or baking and often both. Our setup and breakdown crew outdid themselves with record timing. We only had one day to do setup. They lugged in almost 150 boxes of books and media.

Monday was our free day and whatever was left was either taken to a thrift store or other locations or left in the Library's Discovery box, which then gets distributed to other needy locations.

RIVER FRIENDS BOARD REPORTS

Treasurer's Report

Report for FY from May 1, 2022—April 30, 2023. Our current balance is \$56,640.80. Gross profits are \$13,800.00 with a net profit of \$8,396.51.

These are the major revenue sources: Book Sales of \$10,231.45; Online Book Sales through Book Forest of \$1,166.19; Donations of \$866.05; New member and renewal dues of \$845.00; Book Cart sales of \$642.57.

These are the major expenses: Library requests of \$2,058.62; Event costs of \$1,241.67; Meeting expenses (including our annual luncheon) of \$1,176.69; Volunteer insurance of \$1,015.00; Forestville storage unit rental of \$650.00; Office supplies and other materials of \$541.96; Advertising and publicity of \$514.99.

Membership Report

For FY 22-23, there were a total of 123 memberships including 55 life members. We made a total of \$845.00 on new and renewal memberships
