Sonoma County Library is proud to strengthen our community through meaningful cultural and educational partnerships, including two collaborations this season that reflect our commitment to learning, dialogue, and shared experience.

This winter, we are partnering with KRCB, Northern California Public Media, to present the Emmy Award-winning Climate California, a screening and

discussion series exploring urgent environmental issues facing our region.

By hosting these documentaries in our libraries, we create accessible, community-centered spaces where you can learn about climate impacts, hear from local experts, and engage in thoughtful conversations about the future of our state.

This partnership underscores our role as a trusted source of information and a convener of public dialogue on issues that matter to Sonoma County. Our first screening will be held December 17 at the Rohnert Park Cotati Regional Library, with additional screenings and panel discussions scheduled in

January.

We are also delighted to continue our partnership with the Santa Rosa Symphony, whose musicians bring extraordinary talent into our branches each year. These free concerts fill our libraries with joyful, welcoming music that is accessible to all. Families, seniors, and young listeners come together to enjoy world-class performances in an intimate setting that fosters connection and community spirit.

On December 16, the Youth Orchestra—led by Music Director Francesco Lecce-Chong—will perform classic and popular holiday favorites at the Central Santa Rosa Library in a festive 30-minute program showcasing Sonoma County's premier young musicians.
