A New Library for Roseland

It's official - the Sonoma County Library and the City of Santa Rosa are partnering to build our first new library in 20 years!

The City of Santa Rosa has chosen Swinerton as the design-build firm for the Hearn Community Hub project, located in southwest Santa Rosa.

The hub campus will include a library and fire station in its first phase. Swinerton will work with Jayson Architecture for the library, and Shah Kawasaki Architects for the fire station. Both architecture firms are highly experienced in library and fire station design, and have worked on projects throughout California.

This is not the final design—much more has to be done to refine it—but this is the design direction, and we are pleased with its flexible interior, striking exterior, and naturalistic landscaping plan.

The Swinerton proposal was also the highest-ranked choice in a community survey, and we are so pleased that all the participants in the process came to a unanimous decision for the direction of this exciting project.

The design phase will officially begin soon, and the City of Santa Rosa has scheduled a community meeting to present the design to stakeholders.

The "Vision Unveiling Ceremony" will take place on Thursday, December 12 from 6-8 pm at The Backdrop in Santa Rosa. Invitations to the surrounding community will be sent out soon. We hope to see you there!

Sonoma County Library recognizes Native American & Indigenous Peoples' Month throughout November with librarian-curated reading lists, special in-person events, virtual author talks, and more.

The monthlong celebration expresses the library's respect for local Native American communities, including the Miwok, Wappo, Wintun, Pomo, and Patwin, as well as the Indigenous Peoples from across the world who now make Sonoma County their home.

To create a stronger connection with Indigenous Peoples, the library partnered with local Southern Pomo artist Nicole Martinez Jones, a Sonoma County-based illustrator known for her whimsical drawings focused on local flora and fauna.
